



Water Camp

Oct. 10-12, 2008 at the Keystone Science School in Summit County

The Colorado River District and the Keystone Science School are sponsoring a two-night, three-day Water Camp for Western Colorado high school students who want to learn in depth about water in the West. The camp includes field trips to the top of the Continental Divide to view a watershed and inspections of local streams and water management facilities.

Water is the No. 1 natural resource issue in Colorado. Students will learn about Colorado's position as a headwaters state and how this precious resource is highly managed and distributed. Students will learn about the Law of the River and take part in their own debate about how water should be managed in the face of growing populations and demand.

- The schedule is from noon Friday, Oct. 10, 2008 to noon Sunday, Oct. 12. Students will stay in Keystone Science School dorms and eat in the Science School dining hall. The Keystone Science School is a well established and licensed facility dedicated to natural resource education.
- The cost is \$25 per student for the entire weekend. Scholarships are available.
- The camp is made possible by the Colorado River District, which has been protecting Western Colorado water since 1937.
